Boulder Area Activities

Boulder, the county seat of Jefferson County, Montana, is centrally located and offers a variety of indoor and outdoor recreational activities including hiking, biking, rock climbing, fishing, hunting, camping, swimming, skiing, and horseback riding.

Jefferson County Courthouse

The courthouse is centrally located in Boulder. It was finished and dedicated in 1889 and is listed in the National Record of Historical Places. The courtroom is impressive with elaborate woodwork, stenciled walls and wooden gallery seats that feature a place for cowboy hats.

The courthouse is open Monday through Friday, 8am – 5pm every day except holidays.

St. John's The Evangelist Catholic Church

The Boulder Valley Catholic Church is located a few miles out of Boulder on Highway 69 and holds mass one Sunday every month all summer long. The headstones in the cemetery bear names of many of the area's original settlers. More can be learned about the history of Boulder Valley at the Heritage Center on Boulder's Main Street or at the community library.

Heritage Center

The Heritage Center, also known as the Jefferson County Genealogy & Heritage Corp., is dedicated to preserving Jefferson County genealogy, history, and culture. The museum-like center has a photo history, as well as items, related to the history of Jefferson County and the various people that settled here.

Boulder River Carousel

The historic carousel originally made by and for residents of the State School for the Developmentally Disabled in Boulder was originally build in 1960. It has since been moved to the Jefferson County Fair Grounds and, at this time, is available for rides on July 4th and during the fair/rodeo weekend. Cost of riding the carousel is 25 cents. Tizer Botanic Gardens & Arboretum

Tizer is one of only three internationally accredited arboreta in the United States that is privately owned and Montana's only full-time operated Botanical Garden and Arboretum. Beautiful gardens, walking trails, garden center, and event venue are some of the highlights. There are special events offered throughout the summer and fall.

Jefferson County Museum

The Jefferson County Museum is off Interstate 15 at the Clancy exit. Drive into town and the museum is in the red schoolhouse across from the post office. The museum features permanent displays of a late-19th century schoolroom, a hand-built frontier town and a wind-up phonograph, as well as an extensive exhibit about the Jefferson County mining community of Elkhorn.

The museum is open from 1:00 pm - 5pm on Fridays, and 10:30 am - 4:00 pm on Saturdays.

Comet and Elkhorn Ghost Towns

Comet was first mined in 1880, it produced lead, zinc, iron, copper, silver and gold ore and was one of the richest mines in the district. By the 1900s it had peaked and was formally vacated in 1940. Comet is still one of the most intact ghost towns and has not been formally restored or preserved.

The town is located on private land, but is open to the public.

Comet is located 10 miles south of Boulder on Interstate 15 off of the High Ore exit.

Elkhorn was booming in 1870 when silver was discovered. Most of the building and other property in Elkhorn are still in private ownership so if you visit, enjoy your stay, but do not disturb the residents. Be sure to travel on through the town to the cemetery. There are also hiking trails leading from the cemetery area and picnic and camping areas just below the town. A display about Elkhorn can be found in the Jefferson County Museum in Clancy.

Elkhorn is located about 18 miles from Boulder. Travelling south on highway 69 about 4.5 miles from Boulder is a well-marked turn off to Elkhorn. Turn left onto a dirt road, then just after crossing the Boulder River, turn right. At all other junctions keep left for about 12 miles.

Ringing Rocks

The rocks in this unique geologic area chime when tapped lightly with a hammer. It is believed that the ringing is a combination of the composition of the rock and the way the joining patterns have developed as the rocks have eroded away. If a boulder is removed from the pile, it doesn't ring. This is one of two places in the world where ringing rocks are found. The other place is in Pennsylvania.

This unique geological formation is located approximately 18 miles east of Butte and north of I-90. Travel is on a gravel, windy road. Exit 241 (Pipestone) from I-90, travel east on a gravel road (parallels the interstate) for about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile, then turn north on a gravel road, cross the railroad tracks and continue north for approximately 3.5 miles. A high clearance vehicle is recommended, particularly for the last $\frac{1}{4}$ mile. Follow the #2 signs.

Lewis and Clark Caverns State Park

Known as the most colorful caverns in the Northwest, these caves are lined with a variety of vibrant stalactites, stalagmites, columns and helicites. Besides touring the caves, there are hiking and bike trails with scenic views of the Jefferson River valley. There are also informative interpretive programs and ranger talks as well as the guided tours of the caverns.

The cavern tours are conducted daily May 1 through September 30, and are a 2-mile, 2-hour walk with some stooping and bending required. The trail to the cave entrance gains 300 feet in elevation. Inside the caverns, there are 600 descending stairs. The cave temperature is 50 degrees.

Park admission is free for Montana registered vehicles, while fees apply for out-of-state visitors. Guided daily tours are offered. The state park also offers year-round camping.
